These are to require thee to Survey and lay out to the sd Nehemiah Allen according to the Method of Townships appointed three hundred Acres of Land (in part thereof) that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians, and make Returns thereof into the Surveyors Office at Philada Where this Warrt is to remain & a Copy thereof to be delvd thee attested by the Secretary, Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 11<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> Month 1701.
