

which he hath agreed to pay forty pounds on or before the first day of ye Sixth
month next. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey to ye sd Thomas

the said quantity of One hundred Acres or thereabouts in ye place aforesd

-said where Vacant & not yet taken up nor is Conceal'd nor Seated by ye
Indians and make returns into ye Gen' Surveyors Office at Philad'lia
Where this Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be Deliv'd to thee
Certified by ye Secretary wch Survey to be by thee made as aforesd.

in case ye sd Thomas Ashton shall fulfill ye agreemt aforesd be

Valid otherwise ^{Shall} ye same to be Void and of no other Effect than if
ye same had never been made, nor this Warrt Ever granted.
