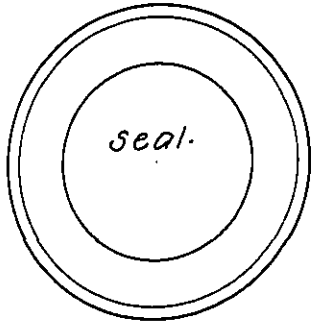


Pensylvania ss.*By the Commissioners of Property.*

At the Request of Colum Macquair late of the Province of West New Jersey that we wold Grant him to take up amongst the New Surveys in Chester County the quantity of two hundred Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet^{rs}. use Twenty Pounds Money of Pensylvania for the whole. and the Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Colum Macquair within the said County according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of Land that has not been heretofore Surveyed nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Colum fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made northis Warrant ever granted Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 10th day of the fourth Month Anno Dni. 1717.
