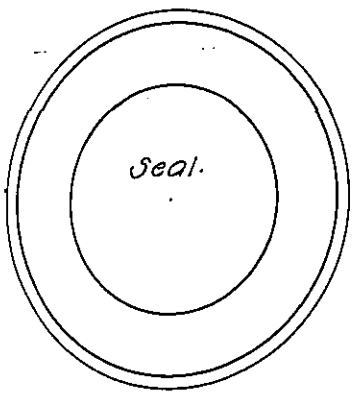


Pensilvania ss.

Upon an agreement now made with John Buckley, Joseph Grub & Benjamin Moulder for the parcel of Land Situate in Rockland Manor between Naaman's Creek & the old Plantation called Stockdales & between the Kings Road and Delaware River supposed to contain about three hundred & fifty Acres for which they agree to pay to y<sup>e</sup> Use of the Proprietary Trustees after the rate of forty pounds Money of Pensilva<sup>a</sup> & Hundred Acres & the yearly quit-rent of one Shilling Sterling in like manner. These are to authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the sd. John Buckley, Joseph Grub & Benjamin Moulder the Said Tract or parcel of Land according to the above description & to Divide the Same into such Shares or parts as they shall agree unto, and make Exact Returns of y<sup>e</sup> whole with the respective divisions into the Secretarys Office in order for a further confirmation which Survey in case the said John, Joseph and Benjamin fulfill the above agreement at Return of Said Survey shall be Valid otherwise the Same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever
