

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and Seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 19th day of the 7th month 1701

*I do hereby certify that I have caused to be Resurveyed unto Thomas Moor his Plantation whereon he now lives reputed to contain one hundred acres scituate in the Township of Concord in the County of Chester, The said Tract beginning at a corner marked white oak standing in the Street of the said Township of Concord being also a corner tree of Thomas King's Land, from thence by the said Street South twenty four degrees thirty minutes East thirty six perches and a half to a white oak stump, from thence by the Lands of Nathaniel Park and Joseph Nicklin East twenty four degrees thirty minutes North five hundred forty three perches to a black oak, from thence North twenty four degrees thirty minutes West thirty six perches and a half to a white oak, from thence by the lands of Robert Chamberlain and the aforesaid Thomas King West twenty four degrees thirty minutes South five hundred forty three perches to the first mentioned white oak. Containing one hundred twenty three acres and one hundred thirty nine perches. Resurveyed the 9th day of the 8th month 1701 and Returned according to the abovesaid Resurvey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governours Secretarys Office the 7th day of the 9th month 1701. *Edwd. Pennington Surv. Genl.**
