

Pensylvania SS:

By the Commissioners of Property.



At the Request of Hans Moyer now of the Township of Strasburg in this Province, that we would grant him to take up in or near the Said Township the quantity of three hundred and fifty Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> use five and thirty Pounds mony of the said Province for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres and in proportion for the fifty acres. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Hans Moyer in or near the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of three hundred and fifty acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into ye Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Hans fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 27<sup>th</sup> day of September Anno Dni 1717.
