 1702 a Certain tract of Land in ye County of Chester beginning a small white or Saplin
 in the Welsh Line from then north north West @ 248 perches to another wt or. mark'd
 from then East north East by a line of marked trees and vacant Land 320 perches
 to another wt or. marked then by a line of trees marked South South East 248 per
 ches to a stake set in ye Ground from thence by a Line of marked trees west south
 west: 320 perches to ye place of beginning Containing 492 acres of Land and is
 according to ye bounds above described Return'd into ye General Survey
 Office at Philadelphia ye 6th day of ye 5th mo. 1703.
