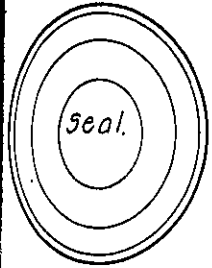


Pensilvania }



William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties annexed.

At the Request of Christopher Pennock Attorney for his son Joseph Pen-

nock that I would grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in right of Francis and George Rogers first purchasers of five thousand Acres by them sold to Geo. Collet. These are to require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Joseph Pennock according to the method of Townships by me appointed the said Number of five hundred Acres of Land in the next Township that shall ^{be} laid out joyning on Marlborough Township now surveying, where it has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is Concealed nor Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Which Survey being duly made and returned shall ~~be~~ if Seated within twelve Months after be confirmed to him and his Heirs for ever. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 7th of ye 1st moth 170⁹.
