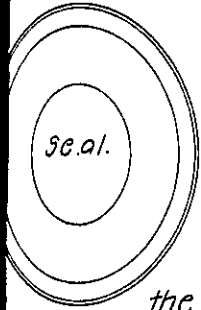


Pennsylvania ss:

At the Request of John Pearsal of the County of Chester that we would Grant him to take up amongst the late surveys made back in the said County the quantity of Two hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Prop<sup>rs</sup> use Twenty Pounds for the whole and the Yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres These are ~~to~~ to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Pearsal in the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Two hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said John fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be voyd as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever Granted Given under our hands & Seal of ye Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> ye 13<sup>th</sup> of x<sup>br</sup> A.D. 1717.
