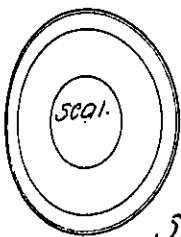


Pennsylvania ss.

suing shall be valid otherwise shall be void & of no Effect Given under our
hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 4th day of ye 2^d moth 1706.
