

By virtue of a General Warrant from the Commiss^{rs}. of Property bearing date the 20th of the 3rd mo 1703 for Resurveying of lands in the County of Chester

There is Resurvey'd unto Thomas Pascal and Henry Flower a Tract of land in Edgmont in the County of Chester (being part of a Tract of 500 acres survey'd in the Year 1684 to Wm. Smith Purchaser.) Beginning at a White oak at the Corner of Samuel Bishops land Thence running south sixty six Degrees west eighty eight perches to a post at a Corner of John Pennels land then by the line of the said Pennels land south 24 degrees east four hundred and eighty perches to a post Then by the lands of Philip Yarnal and John Worral North sixty six degrees east eighty eight perches to a Corner of the said Samuel Bishops Land Then by the same North 24^d west four hundred and eighty perches to the place of the Beginning Containing Two hundred and sixty four acres. Resurvey'd the 2^d of the 4th mo 1703 & J. S. Taylor.
