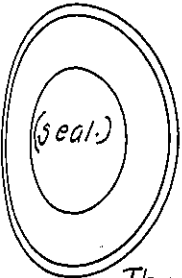

At the Request of Christopher Pennock That I would grant him to  
take up three hundred Acres of Land in right of Francis and Geo. Rog-  
ers Purchasers of five thousand Acres by them sold to Geo. Collet

These are to require thee to Survey or cause to be surveyed ~~unto~~ unto  
him according to the method of Townships by me Appointed the said number  
of three hundred Acres of Land in the next Township that shall be laid out  
joyning on Marlborough Township now Surveying where it has not been al-  
ready Survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians, and  
make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office w<sup>ch</sup> Survey being duly  
made and returned shall, if seated within twelve months after be confirm-  
ed to him and his Heirs forever, Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelph-  
ia the 7<sup>th</sup> of ye first month 170<sup>9</sup>
