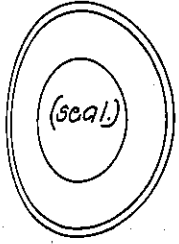

William Penn. Absolute Proprietary & Gov<sup>r</sup> in Chief of the Province  
of Pensilvania & Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Joseph Pike by his Attorney Thomas Story That I would  
Grant him a Resurvey on Ten Thousand Acres of Land being part of a Tract  
of Thirty Thousand Acres laid out to S<sup>r</sup> Matthias Vincent & Comp<sup>ny</sup> in the  
County of ~~Philadelphia~~ <sup>Chester</sup>; these are to will and require thee forthwith to  
Resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd to him the said ten Thousand Acres,  
Running Lines of Division about the same, and make Returns thereof  
into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Pensbury  
the 29<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> Month 1700.
