

Surveyd and laid out the 30<sup>th</sup> day of Janu<sup>ry</sup> 1729, by virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of the first month 1720 unto Joseph Pyle a piece of Land situate part in Chester ~~&~~ County and part in the County of Newcastle. Beginning at a Spanish Oak at a Corn<sup>er</sup> of Other Land of the said Joseph Pyle. Thence by the same South 48 deg<sup>s</sup> West 170 perches to a post Then South 40 deg<sup>s</sup> East 100 perches to a Gum tree Then East North East 80 perches to a white Oak by a Run Then up the same 60 perches to another white Oak, Then North East by North by the land of John Gibbons 20 perches to the place of Beginning Containing fifty acres with 3 acres added

Returned into the Secretary's Office.
