 of Land ~~is~~ being part of a Township called Limbrick in the County of Philadelphia
 begining at a hickry marked by a Street or Road, Leading through the Land of
 belonging to Jacob Telino and Company from thence by the said Line of mark
 ed trees North East five hundred perches to a post sett in the ground from thence
 North west by a Line of marked trees one hundred and sixty perches to an
 other post sett in the ground from thence South west by a Line of marked trees
 five hundred perches to a post sett in the ground by a Street of 60 foot broad
 left through the said Township from thence by the said Street or Road
 South East one hundred and sixty perches to the place of begining Con
 taining and Laid out for five hundred acres of Land.
