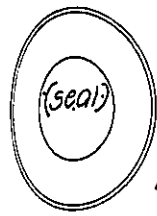


Pennsylvania ss:



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Silas Pryor of the County of Chester that we would Grant him to take up five Hundred acres of Land in this Province for which he hath agreed to pay to the Propriet^{rs} use Fifty Pounds and the Usual Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for Each hundred acres ~~per~~ Ann^{um}. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to ^{be} Survey'd unto the said Silas Pryor according to the method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of five hundred acres of Land in the said Province That has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation, which Survey in Case within three months after location. the said Silas fulfill ye above agreement, shall be Valid otherwise the Same is to be Voyd as if it had never been made or this warrant Ever granted Given under our hands and Seale of ye Province at Philadelphia the 25th day of the fourth month Anno Dni. 1714
