hundred and fifty five Acres of Land in right of Thomas Brasey old Purchaser of five  
thousand Acres being one Moiety of the remaining part of the s<sup>d</sup> purchase undertaken  
up, Sold to ye s<sup>d</sup> Caleb by Tho. Thompson of W. Jersey in right of his Wife Rebecca  
daughter of the s<sup>d</sup> Brasey. The other Moiety now granted to Francis Worley.  
These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him the  
s<sup>d</sup> Caleb Pusey the s<sup>d</sup> Number of five hundred and fifty five Acres of Land in  
the County of Chester where it has not been already survey'd nor taken up, nor  
is concealed nor seated by the Indians, according to the method of Townships  
by me appointed and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office.  
Given under my Hand and seal at Philadelphia the 21<sup>st</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup>  
Mo<sup>th</sup> 170<sup>9</sup>.
