At y<sup>e</sup> Request of Charles Pickering that wee would grant him to take up one hundred Eighty and Six Acres of Land w<sup>ch</sup> is what remains of his whole purchase of one thousand acres to be laid out in y<sup>e</sup> County of Chester and as near y<sup>e</sup> Towne as possible.

These are therefore in y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary's name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him the said number of acres in y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid County where not already taken up according to y<sup>e</sup> method of Townships appointed by y<sup>e</sup> Govern<sup>r</sup>, he seating and Improving the same within six months after y<sup>e</sup> date of survey, and make Returne hereof into y<sup>e</sup> Secretary's Office given at Philadel. y<sup>e</sup> 11 of y<sup>e</sup> 5: mo: 1685.
