I Desire thee to Survey to David Powel in ^{& adjoining to} y^e Mannor of Mountjoy four hundred Acres of Land in one tract as follows:

Begin at y^e Corner of Ph Howels Land then running by y^e sd Land down by Mr Jno Kinseys & up by Do Merediths ~~Corner~~ & so continuing his line come down by a Parallel to y^e Line of y^e Welch Tract till thou wouldst intersect y^e head Line of Kinseys & Howels Land continued from thence ~~two~~ or a very little further run Down as perpendicular as thou canst to y^e general Course of the small Creek there in which include just 500 Acres & out of it lay 100 in y^e Corner between Howels Kinseys & Merediths to Tho. Jones &c. Run also the Welch Line w^{ch} divides the Tract now to be survey'd that an exact Acct may be had of the p^{ty} both within & without y^e Mann^r.

Also at y^e bend of Skuykill between y^e Welch & Swedish Settlements Run out one hundred Acres including Limestone but so as there shall be at least as much left if it can be so Ordered

This Land must front Skuykill & extend back quite to the Surveys of y^e Welch, but pray view well y^e advantages & Disadvantages of the Lands adjoining ^{of them} & if this Survey will incommode them or render any part more unsaleable by dividing one part from another Lott if quite alone for I will not by any means for y^e sale of 100 Acres hurt the sale of 2 or 300.
