



By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 10th day of September 1717 for Surveying to David Powel Surveyor Three thousand acres of land in this Province This may certify that on the 25th of May 1728 I surveyed for the said David Powel the last remaining part or Parcel of the said 3000 acres being three hundred and four acres in one tract situate on the French Creek in the County of Chester beginning at a Corner of James Pugh's land land by the said Creek's side and running North East by the said James Pugh's land three hundred & twenty Perches to a Corner black Oak Then South East by a line of marked trees one hundred sixty two perches to a small hickery marked for a Corner Then South west three hundred twenty four perches to the said Creek then — the same on several Courses about one hundr^d and eighty perches to the place of beginning.
