Note Although the quantity returned much exceeds the Warrant; yet from the relative boundaries; the Warrant appears to have been intended to cover the whole tract Together with the fact of Anthony Schneider formerly being the owner of the tract. The above Tract is found to be wholly the same as a Tract Surveyed 13 November 1809 on Warrant to James Jack for 100<sup>ac</sup>. dated the 20th January 1753 & part thereof patented on sd Warrant - part pat<sup>d</sup>. Philip Eyer, John Snider, Peter Snider, George Guyer & George Unger owners and occupiers - who derive title as heirs & representatives under both the above Warrants.
