These are therefore by vertue of our Commission and in ye name of ye Proprietary to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto them, one hundred acres of land in ye Proprietarys Manner Called Springfield Taking Speciall care that ye best seat be preserved for ye Proprietarys Use, he seating and Improveing the same within six months after ye date hereof, and make returne hereoff to ye Secretary Office dated at Philadelphia ye 7<sup>th</sup> of ye 12<sup>th</sup> mo. 1687/8.
