By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of John Talbot of Burlington in the Province of New Jersey  
 That we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in this Province Originally  
 purchased of the Proprietor by John Dwight <sup>late</sup> of Fulham in the County of Middlesex Gent  
 and since his decease made over to the sd J. Talbot by ye Ex<sup>c</sup> and heirs of ye sd J. Dwight  
 These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyd to the said John  
 Talbot according to the Method of townships appointed the said quantity of five hun-  
 dred acres of land in this Province that has not been already surveyd nor taken up,  
 nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries Office.  
 Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the twenty  
 fourth day of the 4<sup>th</sup> month (June) in ye seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign  
 Lady Anne Queen of Great Britain &c. A. D. 1708.
