



William Penn Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of ye Province of Pennsylvania & ye  
Territories thereunto belonging.

At ye request of Robert Turner yt I would grant him to take up two hundred acres  
of land in part of his Purchase, in ye county of Philadelphia. These are to will &  
require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be surveyd unto him ye s<sup>d</sup> number of acres  
in ye aforementioned County, where not already taken up, according to ye method  
of Townships appointed by me, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's office.

Given at Philadelphia, ye 20<sup>th</sup> of ye 1<sup>st</sup> mo. 1683<sup>1/4</sup>

next to ye City Liberties above the Skoolkill falls.
