silvania & ye Territories therunto belonging.

At ye request of Samuel Allen Purchaser of two thousand acres, yt  
I would grant him to take up his Proportion of land w<sup>th</sup> in ye Liber-  
ties of ye City ~~Phila~~. These are to will & require thee forth w<sup>th</sup> to survey  
or cause to be survey'd unto him <sup>in</sup> ye sd bounds forty acres of land,  
where not already taken up, according to ye method of townships  
appointed by me, & make returns thereof into my Secretarys Office.

Given at Philadelphia ye R. <sup>17<sup>th</sup></sup>/<sub>5<sup>th</sup></sub> 1683.
