At the request of John Arthur of the County of Philad^{ia}. That we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in the manner of Gilberts for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietaries use one hundred pounds part thereof in hand, and the remainder ~~at~~ before the first month next ensuing at farthest with lawful Interest for forbearance, These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the sd John Arthur on ye upper end or side of the sd Manor the sd number of five hundred acres of land in one entire regular piece without culling or choosing or in any wise injuring or depreciating the remaining adjacent land, by a line extended a suitable length to the outlines of ye sd Manor, & make returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this warrt is to remain and a copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary. Which survey in case the sd Jⁿ Arthur, his Heirs Ex^{ts} or assigns shall well & truly fulfill the agreement aforesd be good & valid otherwise shall be void as if the same had never been made nor this warrt ever granted.
