By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of John Arnold. That we would grant him to take up two hundred acres of land in this Province for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietors use Twenty Pounds and the usual yearly Quitrent of one shilling Sterling for each Hundred. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said John Arnold according to the Method of Townships the said quantity of Two hundred acres of land in the said Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is seated by the Indians and make return thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which survey in case the said John Arnold fulfil the Agreement aforesaid, shall be valid otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect, as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 23<sup>d</sup> day of the first month A. D. 1713<sup>1/4</sup>.
