Upon an Agreement made between us and Joseph Ashton of Dublin Township for one Thousand acres of land in the Mann<sup>r</sup> of Gilberts for which he is to pay to the Proprietors Use two hundred and thirty five pounds of Current silver money of this Province upon or before the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the first month next. These are to Authorize and require you to survey and lay out to the s<sup>d</sup> Joseph Ashton One thousand acres of land in the said Mann<sup>r</sup> beginning at a dry hollow vale above Perqueomnick Creek leaving to the Prop<sup>y</sup> the said vale and all the land between the s<sup>d</sup> vale and creeks mouth and running backwards by a line at right angles from the River Skuykill till it intersect with the said Perqueomnick Creek) and by another line parallel to the first taking in the said exact quantity of one thousand Acres. And make returns thereof into the general Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secetary. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at
