By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of John Adams of Upper Hayford in the County of Northton  
 in Great Britain son and heir of Richard Adams<sup>late</sup> of the same place Decd  
 by his Attorney Hugh Sharp that we would grant him to take up in this  
 Province the quantity of five hundred acres of land purchased of  
 the Prop<sup>r</sup> by the said Rich<sup>d</sup> Adams by Indent<sup>ur</sup> of Lease and release  
 dated the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> dayes of ye month called Feb<sup>r</sup> Anno.—1681.  
 These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd  
 unto the said John Adams in the said Province according to the  
 Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred  
 acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is  
 seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys  
 office ~~in~~<sup>in</sup> order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and seal  
 of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 26<sup>th</sup> day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> Anno Dom 1717.  
 To Jacob Taylor Survey<sup>r</sup> General.
