

I do hereby certify that by virtue of a warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the seal of the Province to Thomas Fairman directed bearing date the 1st day of the 2nd 1702 he the said Tho. Fairman hath made return into the General Surveyors office of the survey of a Tract of land surveyed to Robert Ashton the 20th day of the month and year aforesaid which being examined and revised in the said office is as follows.

Situate near the White Marsh in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a black oak in Edward Farmer's line from thence extending northwest in the said Farmer's line 340 perches to an oak sapling thence north east in the line of Michael Thomas 148 perches to an oak sapling from thence southeast by the land of Edw^d Hopton Joseph Knight and Daniel Quare 340 perches to a corner post thence south west 148 perches to the first mentioned black oak containing three hundred and fourteen acres.
Returned into the Secretaries office the 27th 3rd 1702.
