I shouldn't wish any other thing than Mr. Heap to get the Lott. You'l observe its not more than one eighth of the return of survey I made. Any assistance you can give^d in obtaining that Lott of sixty feet front I shall be much obliged to you for, and as to the rest of the Ground I have made improvements on, so that I would not wish that any Person would interfere in applying to the Proprietor for any of the them as I mean to comply with any terms that the Proprietor will select.
