

Philad<sup>a</sup> July 26th 1772.

Mr. McClure.

Sir: Your letter I rece<sup>d</sup> dated the 26th of May last I waited upon Mr  
Phisick & Mr Tilghman the tell me that you will get the land as it  
appears to be much broken no doubt to purchase when Col<sup>o</sup> Arm-  
strong will estimate the value thereof & acre. As to the Lott at the White-  
oak Bottom. I am afraid you'll have to pay three shillings sterling &  
acre ground rent for it. You'll get the whole surveyed & returned you may  
improve it as you mean to make a Purchase of it.
