 a line running from the said River to Conestogo Creek all which  
 Tract of land to be survey'd by vertue hereof Thou art to make ex-  
 act returns into the Secretarys Office for the proper use and behoof  
 of William Penn Esq<sup>e</sup> Proprietary & Governour in chief of the said  
 Province his heirs and assigns forever Given under our hands and  
 the lesser seal of ye Province at Philadelphia the first day of the  
 12<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> February Anno Din 1717/8.
