



By the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> Impow<sup>rd</sup> to grant lots and lands in the Province  
of Pennsylvania and Territorys thereunto belonging.

At ye request of Tho. Fairman, Attorney to Robt Fairman that wee would grant  
him to take in right of W<sup>m</sup> Puryor purchaser of one Thousand acres of land  
the Remainder thereof being three hundred acres in ye County of Philadelphia.  
These are therefore in ye Proprietary name to will and require thee forthwith to sur-  
vey or cause to be surveyd unto him ye said number of acres in ye aforesaid  
County where not already taken up according to ye method<sup>s</sup> of townships  
appoynted by ye Gover<sup>r</sup> he seating and improveing the same within six  
months after ye date of survey and make return hereof into ye Secretary's  
office. Dated at Philadephia ye 2<sup>d</sup> of ye 12<sup>th</sup> mo. 1685.
