Philadelphia Thursday August 16<sup>th</sup> 1781.

The petition of James Parr and William Gray claiming a city Lot in right of a warrant granted to Richard Wall Sen<sup>r</sup> having been sundry times considered, and the Title thereto examined, and the Surveyor General having certified, that upon an accurate search in his Office, he cannot find that said warrant hath been satisfied.

Resolved.

That the Surveyor General do proceed to locate a city lot agreeable to the Terms of the warrant and the usual forms of Office.
