



In pursuance of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property Dated the 20 Day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1725 and by an Order from Jacob Taylor to me derected Surveyd this Tract of Land unto Edward Shippen. Beginning At a small black oak being the Cornear of Hilburns Land. and then North tenn degrees west seventy two pearches By Ezarah Crosdells Land being Samuel Stackhous-cornear also. then East twenty degres south. four hundred and four pearches by Thomas Stackhous-Land to a post being the Cornear of Thomas Stradlins Land then by the said Stradlins Land South ten degres west sixty seven pearches to a post. then by Hilborns Land West twenty degres south. thre hundred ninty and four pearches to the place of beginning Containing one hundred fifty nine acres. the nine acres being for allowance for highways and Roads. acording as usal Surveyd the Eleventh day of June in the year one thousand seven hundred twenty and five.
