At the Request of George Boon jun^r of Abington in this Province that We would Grant him to take up at Oley in the said Province the quantity of four hundred Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees ^{Money of Pennsylvania} six & fifty Pounds for the whole and the Yearly quit rent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said George Boon at Oley aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of four hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated with the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said George fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date here of shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
