At the Request of Richard Jones of Parkeomink in the County of Philad^a that We would Grant him a Certain parcell of Land Joyn- ing to his own Settlement on the East Side of the Land of Edwd Lane. Deceased. Containing one hundred & Eighty Acres for wh- ich he agrees to pay to the Prop^rs Use Forty pounds for the Same & the Yearly Quitrent ~~£~~ of one Shilling Sterling for ye hundred Acres & in like proportion for the Eighty Acres. And Also if upon ye Survey there should be more Land than ye quantity of one hundred and Eighty Acres that then ye sd Richard is to pay for Every Acre over & above that number five shillings and the Same Quitrent with ye Rest. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the Said Rich^d Jones in the place aforesaid the Said Quantity of one hundred & Eighty Acres of Land or more if there be any in the Vacancey not being alredy Surveyed nor approp- riated And make Return there of into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the Said Richard pay down to the Proprietors use on ye 16th day of ye next third Month twenty Pounds and ye Remainder on ye 16th day of ye next 9th Month ^{with six months Interest} shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever gr- anted.
