These therefore are to require thee in lieu of the sd Land to Survey and lay out to the Said Griffith Jones the Said quantity of Two thousand nine hundred and twenty Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up. nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians. together w<sup>th</sup> the same Allowance for Roads and Barrens as is made by Law in Resurveys, and make Returns there of into the General Surveyor's Office at Philadelphia, where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered <sup>to</sup> thee by the Secretary. who is also to take a Duplicate of thy Return into his Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 18<sup>th</sup> of ye 12<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
