

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 27th day of the 1st month 1701. I do hereby certify that I have caused to be Resurveyed unto Elizabeth now Wife to Ralph Jackson a certain Tract of Land scituate in the Township commonly called Whitpain's in the County of Philadelphia formerly laid out to her for three hundred acres in right and as part of her Father George Palmer's purchase of five thousand acres, but now found to contain three hundred and eleven acres and one hundred and two perches. Beginning at a post hard by a marked hickery, being a Corner dividing it from William Palmer's Land, from thence by his said Line of marked trees North East four hundred sixty and six perches to another Corner post dividing it from the said William Palmer's Land, and also standing in the Line of Richard Whitpain's Land, from thence by the said Line of marked trees North West one hundred and seven perches to a third Corner post dividing it from the Land belonging to Thomas Fitzwater, from thence by his said Line of marked trees South West four hundred sixty and six perches to a fourth Post standing in the Line of the Plymouth Township, from thence by the said Line South East one hundred and seven perches to the first mentioned Corner post. Containing as above expressed. Resurveyed the 11th day of the 3^d month 1701, and Returned according to the afore said Resurvey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's Office the 25th day of the 4th month 1701.
