

By virtue of a Warrant from the proprietarie & Gov' for laying out unto Andrew Rudman ten thousand acres of land for the use of himself and several of the Swedes bearing date the 21st day ^{out} of 1701.

There was Survey'd and Laid ^{out} the 28th of the fifth month 1704 unto Mounse Jones four hundred and two acres of land situate on the East Side ^{of} Schuykill - in the County of Philadelphia begining at a post by the River Schuykill at the corner of Justa Justasons land then by the line of the said Justa Justasons land North twenty degrees East Eight hudred and Seventy perches to a post again by the said Justa Justasons land East South East Seventy three perches to a post Then by the line of Andrew Rudmans land South twenty degrees west Eight hundred Ninety and Six perches to Schuykill River then up the same on the Courses thereof to the beginning.
