
 William Penn, Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in Chief
Seal. of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of William Jenkins. That I would grant him to take up Two Hundred and fifty Acres of Land in Right of an old Purchase of one Thousand Acres by himself formerly made. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto him the Said Number of Acres of Land ^{etc.} in this Province that has not been already taken up, nor concealed, nor cleared by the Indians. to be laid out according to the Method of Townships by me appointed, and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the Sixteenth day of the Sixth Month A. D. 1700.
