

Pursuant to a Warrant under the Hand and seal of the Prop^r and Governour bearing date the 15th day of the first month 170⁹. Granting unto Philip James a Resurvey on a Tract of land situate in the County of Philadelphia. Laid out for four hundred acres to Charles Jones of Bristol.

There is Resurvey'd unto Philip James a Tract of land in the County of Philadelphia on the River Schuylkill (viz^t on the east side of the said River) Beginning at a stake by Jonas Smiths land, from thence by the said land Northeast by east five hundred and twenty perches to a stake in the Germantown Line Thence by the said line Southeast one hundred seventy four perches to a Chesnut oak, from thence by Richard Sneads land West southwest five hundred and sixty perches to a Spanish oak by Skuykill then by the said River North forty degrees westerly seventy five perches to the place of beginning. Containing four hundred and four acres.
