I hereby Certifie into his Secretaryes office. y<sup>t</sup> I have Caused to be Surveyd and set out ye 1<sup>st</sup> of ye 1<sup>st</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1684 unto Jn<sup>o</sup> Jennet, Purchaser, his Lott in ye Lib<sup>r</sup>tys of Philadelphia. Containing Eight Acres of Land. Begining at a Corn<sup>r</sup> post being ye Corn<sup>r</sup> post of Jn<sup>o</sup> Songhurst, from thence by ye Land of ye said Songhurst E. N. E. 60 p<sup>r</sup>ches to a Corn<sup>r</sup> post. thence S. S. E. by ye Land of Enoch Flower 21 perches to a Corn<sup>r</sup> post. thence W. S. W. by ye Land of ye said Flower 60 p<sup>r</sup>ches to a Corn<sup>r</sup> post. thence N. N. W. by ye Street 21 perches to ye first mentioned post, and is Accordingly Entred and Recorded in my office Philadelphia this 6<sup>th</sup> of ye 5<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.
