

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hands of Edward Shippen, Griffith Owen, Thomas Story and James Logan the Prop^{rs} & Governour's Commissioners of Property and the seal of the Province bearing date the 10th day of the 12^mo 1701. ordering two thousand nine hundred and twenty acres of land to be laid out unto Griffith Jones in lein of the like quantity formerly Located to him (in Right of his original purchase of 5000 acres) on several tracts before granted and since confirmed to others.

There is survey'd to the said Griffith Jones in part of the said 2920 acres a tract of land in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a Red oak marked at a corner of James Claypoole's land from thence Southwest by the same land 480 perches to a corner marked hickory from thence Southeast by James Peter's land 200 perches to a post from thence Northeast by William Jones his land 480 perches to a post near a corner marked black oak sapling from thence Northwest by ~~John~~
~~day's land~~ 200 perches to the place of Beginning Containing six hundred acres. Survey'd by Thomas Fairman.
