



By Virtue of A Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 28th of September 1719. Surveyed and laid out for Derrick Jansen (in Right of Thomas Parkhurst Cityzen and Stationer of London) A Certain Tract land scituate on a branch of Perqueomie in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a Corner Stake of Christian Myars Land thence by the ^{sd} land North East one hundred and ^{Eight} forty perches to a Stake. thence by Vacant land North West Two hundred and fourty perches to a Stake. Thence by Vacant land South West Two hundred Ninety and Eight perches to a large white oak Marked for a Corner. Thence by Vacant - Three hundred perches to a Stake put for a Corner standing in Jn^o Rudds line. thence by the ^{sd} Rudds land North East fourty & five perches to a Black oak Tree being a Corner of ye ^{sd} Rudd land. thence by the Same ^{South East} fourty Two perches to a Stake. being a Corner of Jn^o Isaac Clyns land. thence by the ^{sd} Clyns land North East one hundred and five perches to a Corner of Hans Myars land. thence ^{North west} by the above ^{sd} Christian Myars land one hundred and Two perches to the place of beginning. Containing five hundred Acres with Allowance of Six & Cent. Surveyed feb^r ye 19th 1719/20.
