

Pensilvania ss. By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Richard Gregory now of Oley, that We would
 Seal Grant him to take up at or near the same place the Quantity of
 Two hundred Acres of Land for which He agrees to pay to the
 use of the Trustees of ye Province within three Months after the date
 here of eight & Twenty pounds Mony of Pensilvania, ^{for yewhole} and the Yearly
 quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each Hundred Acres.
 These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be
 Survey'd unto the said Richard Gregory at the place afore said
 according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quant-
 ity of Two Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Sur-
 veyd nor ^{rop} appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians, and make Returns
 thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said
 Richard fulfill the above agreement shall be Valid otherwise the
 same shall be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant
 ever granted, Given und^r our Hands & ye Seal of ye Province at Philada-
 ye 1st of ye 3^m A. D. 1719.
