At the Request of Francis Gandouet of Philadelphia, Practitioner in Physick that We would Grant him to take up the quantity of Five hundred Acres of Land in this Province the Original purchase made of the Propriet^r by Ann Crawley and Since Convey'd (as is Alledged) unto the Said Francis Gandouet, These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd and laid out in Right of the said Purchase According to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Five hundred Acres of Land in this Province (first deducting out of the same the proportion to be laid ^{out} in Right thereof in the Liberties of Philadelphia) that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 10th day of the 4th Month Anno. Dni. 1717.
