At the Request of Joseph Growdon in behalf of the heirs of George Fox
That I would grant him to take up for Thomas Lower ~~four hundred~~ ye^sd
and eight Acres and one third of an acre being one third of George
Fox's purchase of 1250 Acres (Liberty Land excepted) bequeathed
by the sd George in his last Will and Testam^t to the sd Thomas Lower
his Children. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or ca-
use to be survey'd according to the Method of Townships by me appoint-
ed to the sd Thomas Lower and his Children the sd Number of four
hundred and eight Acres and one third of an Acre ~~of~~ land in
this Province not already survey'd nor taken up, nor conceal'd nor
seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into my Secre-
taries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia
the tenth day of October 1701.
