That I would grant him to take up for Thomas Lower ~~four~~ ^{ye sd} four hundred
and eight Acres and one third of an acre being one third of ^A George
Fox's purchase of 1250 Acres (Liberty Land excepted) bequeathed
by the ^{sd} George in his last Will and Testam^t to the ^{sd} Thomas Lower
& his Children. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or ca-
use to be survey'd according to the Method of Townships by me appoint-
ed to the ^{sd} Thomas Lower and his Children the ^{sd} Number of four
hundred and eight Acres and one third of an Acre ~~of~~ of land in
this Province not already survey'd nor taken up, nor conceal'd nor
seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into my Secreta-
ries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia
the tenth day of October 1701.
